Duolingo Review An Addictive Way to Learn a Language

duolingo Game makers have tapped into the psychology of the way the human mind rewards itself, and can now make games that are so addictive that the industry has earned more revenue than the movie and music industries combined, every year for the past eight years.

Duolingo has used some of this methodology to make the process of learning a new language easy, fun and ~yes~ addictive. It's free to play the basic version. A sound is played making me feel like Pavlov's dog whenever I get an answer right. You get little merit badges and achievement awards as you progress.

Two contrasting things occur to me:

- as I progress through the course I am questioning how much I am actually learning.
- I am indeed learning bits of the language and enthused to want to learn more.

This seems important; the ability to start. Most people would like to learn a second language but imagine it would be too hard, expensive and time-consuming.

Duolingo has taken the first 2 negatives out of the equation. It isn't hard and it's free. It takes time but that's ok if it feels like a game. I'm trying German because I have a co-worker who can speak German. Interestingly I've shown it to my solitaire-playing partner and now she is spending half the time she would have wasted playing a digital card game learning Spanish! She is progressing nicely.

These towns already have satellite NBN and there is no further 'roll out' occurring or planned in the future. The government policy is that landline phones, and associated internet services will remain in place in all areas that only have access to NBN in the form of satellite or Fixed Wireless.

In the mean time, have some sympathy for those in areas where NBN services are replacing phone linesthey receive even more SCAM calls, and are going to be having a lot harder time working our which ones are

To repeat—if you live in the 6262 postcode area, any calls you receive of this type are scams. Hang up.
